HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE:

The property at the northeast corner of Brand Blvd. and Broadway was occupied in 1921 by the First Savings Bank of Glendale. Two years later, in August 1923, First Savings was bought by Security Trust & Savings Bank which constructed the first six-story buildings in Glendale using a simplified classical architectural design. Construction required that the existing structure on the site, the Pacific Electric Depot, be demolished in 1923. The bank building has continually had tenants much like those who occupied it in 1921, a bank on the first floor and offices above. Alfred F. Priest, who designed at least nine buildings on Brand Blvd. designed the building.
