**HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE:**

The character defining features of this English Tudor Revival home include the steeply pitched front gable with an attached hipped roof to the left, the brick exterior material, the recessed entryway with an arched opening, the octagon two-story tower to the left of the front entry, deep and molded profile windows with multiple panes, a Porte Cochere, leaded windows along the side and back of house. Alterations to the home include a new roof. The pool house and swimming pool appear to be newer but there are no permits on file. These additions are not visible from the public right of way. This home was also designed by noted Glendale architect Alfred Priest. Priest is credited with numerous notable buildings and homes in Glendale, some of them still exist today including the Security Trust and Savings Bank at 100 N. Brand Boulevard.
