STATE LAW

REQUIRES BUSINESSES & MULTI-FAMILY RESIDENCES TO RECYCLE

The State of California passed Assembly Bill 341 (AB 341) which requires recycling beginning July 1, 2012 at the following properties:

- Businesses that dispose of 4 cubic yards or more of solid waste a week
- Multi-family dwellings of 5 units or more

These businesses must engage in one or any combination of the following:

- Redeem recyclables at a certified recycling center for California Redemption Value (CRV).
- Separate recyclables on site and place them out for collection by a permitted hauler.
- Use a permitted hauler that separates recyclables from trash for diversion.

Frequently Asked Questions

Common Recyclable Materials

Q: Does my business have to recycle?

A: If your business generates 4 or more cubic yards of trash per week or has 5 or more residential units, then you must recycle according to AB 341.

Q: What is meant by a business?

A: A business is considered a retail establishment, office building, restaurant, non-profit, government office and/or school.

Q: What multi-family units are regulated?

A: Apartment buildings, condominiums and townhouses with five units or more must comply.

Q: Are special events required to recycle?

A: Yes, events that generate 4 cubic yards of refuse or more meet the legislative requirements of AB2176.

Q: Am I required to choose a specific hauler?

A: No. You may choose any permitted hauler in the City of Glendale. Please see list of 2014 permitted haulers on the back of this brochure.

Q: Does the City of Glendale offer recycling services?

A: Yes, at no additional cost. Contact the Integrated Waste Management Division at **(818) 548-3916** for more information.

Q: Can I self-haul my recyclables to a recycling center?

A: Yes.

Q: How can recycling save my company money?

A: Ask your hauler about reducing the size or pickup frequency of your trash bin and about adding a free or reduced cost recycling bin.
