Kenneth Road Improvements and Sidewalk Installation
As Part of Kenneth Road Rehabilitation Project

Dear Resident,

The Public Works Department has determined the need for infrastructure improvements along Kenneth Road between Sonora Avenue and the northerly City Boundary (City of Burbank) which would enhance the appearance of the street. Staff presented the proposed changes and improvements during a Community Meeting on November 16, 2017 at Balboa Elementary School with no objections from the attendees. The project is scheduled to start in May 2018; however the removal of trees that are in conflict with the proposed sidewalk installation will be done prior to the start date. A notification letter from West Coast Arborists Inc., a contractor the City has hired to complete the tree removals, will be sent to you a week in advance.

Installation of Sidewalk on Both Sides of Kenneth Road

As part of these improvements the City is proposing to install a 5-foot sidewalk on both sides of Kenneth Road between Alameda Avenue and Spazier Avenue (plan of work attached). There is currently no sidewalk in this block. Construction of the sidewalk and ADA access ramps will provide pedestrian access throughout the length of Kenneth Road within the project limit. The public right-of-way is 12-feet wide behind the curb, leaving a 7-foot parkway. As a result, private brushes and stepping stones will be removed and new concrete sidewalk will be constructed in its place. The City will be responsible for installation or relocation of sprinklers, new landscaping, and grading of lawns and parkways affected by the construction of the sidewalk. The project will also include repaving of the street and replacing damaged curb and gutters. The construction of the project is anticipated to start in May 2018.

Installation of Sidewalk on East Side of Kenneth Road

The City is proposing to install a 5-foot sidewalk on the east side of Kenneth Road between Linden Avenue and Allen Avenue (plan of work attached). There is already sidewalk on the west side of this block. The public right-of-way is 12-feet behind the curb, leaving a 7-foot parkway. Construction of the sidewalk and ADA access ramps will provide pedestrian access throughout the length of Kenneth Road within the project limit. As a result, several trees will be removed and new 24-inch box trees planted in their place. Installation of the new sidewalk may require either constructing an 18-inch retaining wall or regrading of private property behind the sidewalk at certain locations. The City will be responsible for installation or relocation of sprinklers, new landscaping, and grading of lawns and parkways affected by the construction of the sidewalk. This work will be performed at no cost to the affected property owner. The project will also include repaving of the street and replacing damaged curb and gutters.

As a result, several trees will be removed and new 24-inch box trees planted in their place. Installation of the new sidewalk may require either constructing an 18-inch retaining wall or regrading of private property behind the sidewalk at certain locations. The City will be responsible for installation or relocation of sprinklers, new landscaping, and grading of lawns and parkways affected by the construction of the sidewalk. This work will be performed at no cost to the affected property owner. The project will also include repaving of the street and replacing damaged curb and gutters. The construction of the project is anticipated to start in May 2018.
