**HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE:**

The subject property meets the qualifications of a historic resource principally because of its representative architecture in the English Tudor style and location with the Rossmoyne neighborhood. The character defining features of the home include the half-timbering in angular and curvilinear lines, varied pattern brickwork along lower and upper story between portions of stucco exterior, leaded glass windows with small rounded panes, molded beams framing windows and doors, a dominate front gable entry, window boxes, and bay windows. A small front porch extends across the front entry. The house sits high above the street, like its neighbors in this portion of Rossmoyne. The roof is composed of wood shake shingles. Some of the home's gables are accented with wooden shingles in varied patterns. Windows have divided lights in either a diamond or square pattern.
