

Glendale Slow Streets Program



To assist in promoting social distancing, Glendale has developed a temporary slow streets program to create more opportunities for residents to bicycle and walk. The program will promote social distancing by encouraging drivers to slow down and recognize that there are more pedestrians and cyclists using the right-of-way during this time.

Slow streets are not closed streets. Automobile traffic can still use the street, but motorists are reminded to slow down and be observant for pedestrians and cyclists as they practice social distancing.

How do you make your street a Slow Street?

- Identify the block and street you wish to make a Slow Street
- Submit a sponsor application
- Submit your application to the City at akamali@glendaleca.gov

The City will evaluate your application to ensure that the street is eligible to be a Slow Street and contact the sponsor prior to deployment.
