PUBLIC NOTICE BY THE CITY OF GLENDALE RELATING TO A SUBSTANTIAL  
AMENDMENT TO THE 2024 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN FOR  
RAPID UNSHELTERED SURVIVOR HOUSING (RUSH) FUNDS

This is an amendment to the 2024 Annual Action Plan for the City of Glendale to receive \$409,957 in Rapid Unsheltered Survivor Housing funds under the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG RUSH) program in accordance with Federal Register Notice (FR-6315-N-01). This amendment reflects only those sections, or portions of sections, within which changes have been made. All other sections remain unchanged.

The City of Glendale will receive a special allocation of ESG RUSH funding to address the needs of individuals who are homeless or at risk of homelessness in areas affected by a major disaster, and whose needs may not be met by other federal disaster programs. The needs of this population may include all ESG eligible activities including emergency shelter, homelessness prevention, rapid rehousing, and street outreach. Additional information will be collected from potential participants to avoid duplication in benefits per Stafford Act.
